Want to learn more about parenting and child development in a fun, friendly, and supportive environment? Try BTC's age-specific courses, which children and their primary caregivers attend together.

Each course offers a hands-on opportunity to develop child-raising skills with the help of BTC's staff of experienced instructors.

Through group activities and individual play-time, caregivers learn how to bring out the best in their children and themselves. Classrooms are furnished with a wide variety of age-appropriate toys and equipment. Adult discussion groups are built into each course so caregivers have an opportunity to share ideas, questions, and concerns with instructors as well as other parents. Courses offered:

Parenting Discussion

During the first five years of life, children change rapidly and dramatically. Research has shown that the years between birth and kindergarten are the most important time for brain development and help determine a child's opportunities for success later in life. No other stage is as critical to a child's ability to later become a healthy, happy adult. To give children the best possible start, parents and primary caregivers need to develop skills to guide and encourage kids as they grow.

BTC's parenting discussion courses offer information on a range of important topics, including building a child's self-esteem, understanding behavior at different ages, encouraging effective communication and cooperation, and fostering positive emotional and social development. Courses offered include:

About the Classes

The parent/child courses are primarily designed for one parent or caregiver and one child, except for the sibling classes. However, young infants are welcome in the parent/child classes.

The Parenting discussion classes are for adults only. No child care is provided.


